LODOLAMACZE (ICEBREAKERS) is a public service announcement which aim is to prise the employers hiring disabled people. In 2019, at the XIV Gala Edition of LODOLAMACZE Competition, our foundation got awarded with a bronze medal for the institution category.

At the I Plebiscite of the Polish Paralympic Committee we have won the Athlete of the year award for 2019.

We also got the recognition at the competition called Działanie Godne Uwagi (Action Notable).

Our mobileR (bike for FrameRunning/RaceRunning) got the title of 'Zakup Prospołeczny' (Pro-social Purchase). The Pro-social Purchase Certificate is given to social enterprises which can show off not only with high quality products or service, but also their achievements in the field of social activity.

## Hearts for bottle caps

Złotowianka has placed 54 heart-shaped containers for plastic bottle caps in different Polish towns and villages. We empty their contents and sell it to a company dealing with plastic waste recycling.

## Foundation Mission

Supporting chronically ill people and the ones with disabilities in reaching their physical and social well-being through raising money for treatment and rehabilitation. Aiming for their independence and self-realisation, especially through FrameRunning – a sport discipline for disabled people (OzN).



## For Whom?

Złotowianka Foundation has been supporting treatment and rehabilitation of ill and disabled people since 2008. We take care of people of all ages: children, the youth and adults, living all around Poland. Among our patients there are people with all kinds of disabilities.

## HelpShop

Another undertaking of the foundation in order to raise funds for supporting the charges is a regular and on-line charity shop. We sell there mainly handmade and recyclable goods made by ladies of the council and volunteers of the foundation. We get the materials for the store's assortment from the friendly companies. The regular store of Złotowianka foundation also plays a role of a flea market – you can get there used items donated by individual people.

## How do we work?

By setting up subaccounts for our charges, where the funds are mobilized, raised from donations and 1% Tax (donation for specific Polish public welfare organization).

We motivate and reward with grants especially those charges who play a lone hand or get involved – who do not only wait for the help of others. Since there happen to occur emergencies, the foundation gets engaged in many charitable actions in order to raise money for their support. For this purpose we organise charity festivals, balls, dinners. We also raise money during competitions organised not only by local councils, but also by other companies and institutions throughout the country, like PEFRON, ROPS, OWES etc.

There is a fundraising platform on which disabled people can raise money for a specified purpose (rehabilitation fixed period, prosthesis purchase, wheelchair purchase etc).

## FrameRunning



Since 2006 we have been implementing FrameRunning in Poland – a sport for disabled people. The Danish people, creators of this sport discipline, have trained our instructors. The first bikes for training FrameRunning were bought in Denmark, but – because they are expensive in our conditions – we produce Polish equivalents – 30-40 % less expensive. The Foundation runs the FrameRunning section – currently, thanks to Złotowianka, this sport can be trained in Warsaw, Poznań, Wrocław, Piła, Rzeszów and in Złotów.

Our competitors win medals in International RaceRunning Competitions in Copenhagen, Polish Championships for Disabled People in Athletics, European Championships in Athletics and Kamila Skolimowska Memorial.

The biggest achievements? We hold two World Records in RaceRunning (Miriam Dominikowska and Partyk Krause), and a bronze medal in the European Para Athletics Championships in 2021 (Zofia Kałucka).
